Hoping to show Canadian kids with cancer that they aren't fighting alone, Airdrie's Tim Harriman will begin a cross-country bike tour this weekend from Victoria, in hopes of raising awareness and funds.

Harriman was diagnosed with leukemia at age 14, withstanding radiation and chemotherapy for nearly three years before beating the disease.

He's hoping to visit the Prime Minister as part of his 'Tour for Childhood Cancer,' as well as visit other kids having to go through what he did.

His 83 day tour will span nearly 8,000 kilometers, in hopes of raising \$100,000, and to have September declared 'Childhood Cancer Awareness Month'.
